Many people are excited to have vaccines as the first step in managing the spread of coronavirus. Unfortunately, there has been a lot of misinformation surrounding the vaccines which is causing panic and impediment even in the educated group. In order to eradicate such confusion and myths about vaccination, a very helpful webinar was conducted by MSMS and Maxfort School. The Principal, Maxfort School Mrs. Ragini Kaul and the Principal, MSMS Mrs. Ruchika Sukhija felicitated the honorable speaker Dr. K.K. Aggarwal. Dr. Aggarwal was the

Dr. Aggarwal was the President of the Heart Care Foundation of India and the Past National President of Indian Medical Association. In 2010, the Government of India honoured him with the Padma Shri, India's fourthhighest civilian award, for his contributions to the field of medicine.

Dr Agrawal did not just prove himself as an excellent physician but also as a commendable teacher. He "mathematically" explained the scientific complexities of coronavirus and its vaccine. The attendees of the webinar included teachers, students, grandparents of the students therefore he assured to untangle everything in the simplest way possible. He elucidated a relation between the virus and the vaccine and made it clear that the vaccine will react but is needless to worry about. He expounded the process of getting infected by the virus and creation of antibodies through the vaccine step by step by stepping down to the layperson's language and making a lot of comparisons. He compared vaccine with special police and gamma interferon with security guard to reassure the understanding of each and everyone. He apprised that most of the deaths caused by the virus are due to carelessness and ignorance of the people, therefore it was necessary to disseminate awareness and encourage people to get vaccination. He talked about the diet which should be followed in order to remain healthy and build a strong immune system in order to "win over the virus".

The hosts of the webinar, the Principal MSMS, Mrs. Ruchika Sukhija and the Principal Maxfort. Mrs. Ragini Kaul expressed their gratitude towards the honorable speaker Dr. K.K. Aggarwal.

The session was then continued by Dr. Anil Kumar, who is the Director in Environment in Delhi

government. He delineated about a new campaign which they initiated in schools: NGT campaign which means Neem, Geloy, Tulsi. Dr Kumar and his team encouraged the students to sow these medicinal plants around them as they are proven helpful amidst COVID19. Students visited classes with the motive of spreading awareness and planting a seed of righteousness in their peers and motivating their elders in young minds.



#### <u>KINDNESS</u> MATTERS: GLOBAL VENTURE

"No act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted."



Mahavir Senior Model School has been the part of a global campaign #Kindness Matters, initiated by UNESCO MGEIP, in collaboration with Mount Abu Public School. This campaign attempts to create a positive culture of kindness, in which every young person's selfless act matters.

An act of kindness by any person is a generous, deliberate gesture or action to another person, animal, or for planet earth. The purpose of Kindness Matters Project has been to mobilize young minds to be kind and compassionate with their transformative acts of kindness. In this regard, UNESCO has called out for kindness stories. Millions of stories from thousands of schools across the globe are being shared with UNESCO every month and MSMS is one them. The students of classes 3rd to 12th, teachers and parents, were the active participants in the campaign,

MSMS, Department of **English** strived to make this campaign a great success. The Department members encouraged the students to write their kindness stories about the kind deeds that they have performed or have seen others performing, and touched their hearts. Various session were undertaken by the teachers to promote the idea of kindness amongst students. These sessions included e-presentations focused on the idea of fostering kind attitude in students, loud reading of real kindness stories by other people, class discussions and brainstorming. The teachers also devoted time to listen to the stories and

persuaded the students to submit it on the Google form.

The response was overwhelming. Within 3 weeks of mooting the campaign to the students, about 300 stories proffered. The teachers of other departments also actively participated in the campaign by submitting their own acts of kindness. The stories were meticulously screened. The stories ranged from a simple act of 'holding the door for someone' to a lifesaving act of 'donating plasma to a stranger '.

Many students shared their positive experiences of the altruistic actions undertaken by their family or acquaintances, like providing food or arranging medicines or oxygen cylinders for people suffering from Covid, while themselves combating with the global pandemic. Around **250 stories** were retained and compiled by the coordinators, which were then sent to UNESCO.

The campaign does not end here, and neither do the kind acts. The phase two is yet to begin, more kindness stories are yet to be told, and more kindness deeds are yet to be done for making the world a better place. Every Life Matters


## WASHING HANDS STOPS THE SPREAD OF GERMS

The session was well appreciated by the students and parents as this basic thing is apt and relevant in the current scenario of the society.




## "Bingo!"







## Blooming Flowers :








## <u>Little Fish :</u>




# Vedic Maths Tricks :

Headmistress Ma'am laid stress on the 'involvement of parents' in child's life. She also had the same opinion of making the child self dependent.





#### BUDDHA JAYANTI CELEBRATIONS



Project lighthouse aims to create a new family of supporters and organising positive events and modules to make them functional in their respective lives.





#### <u>"Parents are the</u> <u>architect of a better</u> <u>tomorrow"</u>



\* Students enacted the role of an animal and shared the facts about it .


\* They made a poster on an animal .
