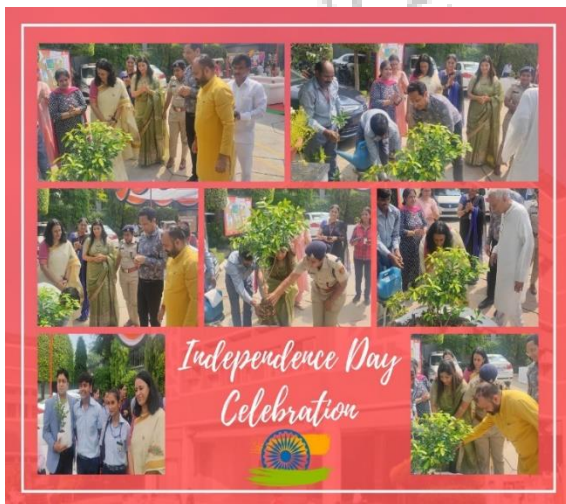

An international talk show was organised on 23rd August 2022, Tuesday regarding atmospheric sciences for classes X, XI and XII by eminent speaker Dr. Piyush Garg.

Dr. Piyush Garg is an Atmospheric Scientist working on combining observations with AI to improve earth system models. He has received

- (1) Ogura Award for Outstanding Student Research
- (2) NASA Group Achievement Award
- (3) Indian Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) Fellowship

He talked about the uncharted waters of atmospheric sciences and talked about his journey and what they do as federal atmospheric scientists at the US Govt Department of Energy.

He showed some examples of his research using satellites, numerical model simulations, supercomputers, and ground-based sensors. He also discussed the overall career opportunities in Atmospheric Sciences in India and abroad. He interacted and answered queries of the students.

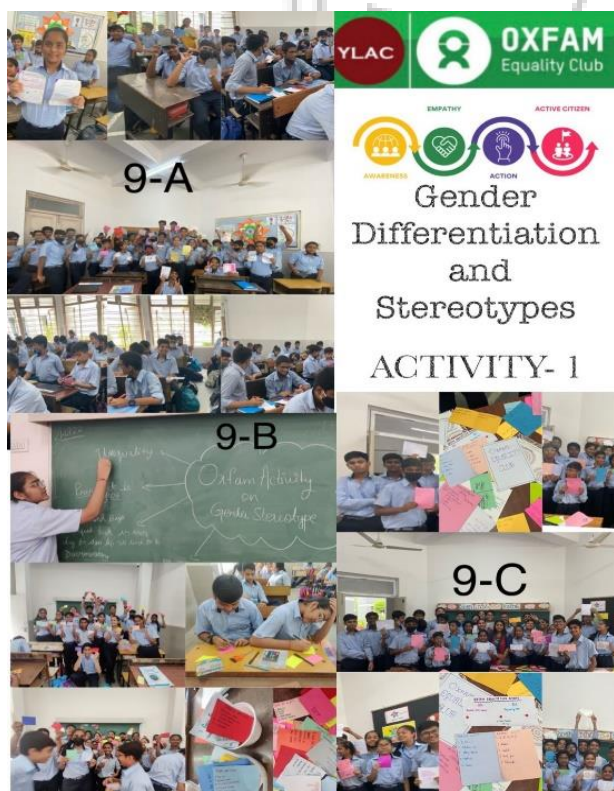
OXFAM INDIA NATIONAL COLLABORATION

DESHBHAKTI CURRICULUM

On the birth anniversary of one of India's most revered revolutionaries Bhagat Singh, Delhi launched another revolution of its own – the Deshbhakti Curriculum. 'Deshbhakti' is a Hindi word for patriotism and 'deshbhakt' is a 'patriot'. Indians strongly believe that true patriotism is essentially loving all living beings and respecting our surroundings. It is a spirit of empathy, tolerance and brotherhood which is enshrined in the constitution of India. Activity: Class presentation

Topic of Activity: Resources and Development

With the objective to identify and appreciate the richness of diverse resources available in our country; understand interdependence of humans on the resources and to develop environmental sensitivity and a sense of responsibility to conserve resources, students of grade X participated in an activity on Resources and Development.

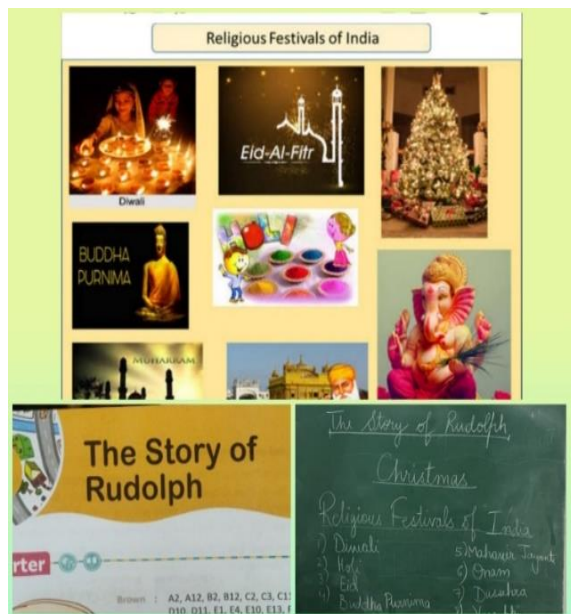
Class was divided into 8 groups and each group was allotted different topics. Students delivered the presentation using charts, posters and slogans. Other group members also participated and enhanced their knowledge by cross questioning a particular group. Students developed understanding of the topic through collaborative and constructive learning. Some topics included Resource Planning, Conservation of Resources, Land Degradation etc.



Class I

Topic: My India, My Pride

The aim of Activity was to nurture the spirit of patriotism among the students. Students drew Tricolour Flag and importance of the three colours was told to them. They were taught to express gratitude to the Nation and salute the Flag.



CLASS III - V

Topic: Celebrating Diversity

1. Religious Festivals of India – With the background of a lesson about Rudolph the reindeer and the story that revolved around Christmas, the teacher initiated discussions on other religions festivals of India and how they bring harmony and happiness in our society.

2. Classical Musical Instruments and The Nine Jewels of Emperor Akbar's Court – Integrating with the Lesson about Tansen, the prominent figure of Hindustani Classical Music, the teacher talked about Akbar's Navratna and Classical musical instruments like Veena, Sitar, Mridangam, Flute etc.





3. Republic Day Parade- Integrated with a lesson based on Royal Parade, the teacher emphasized the elaborate Republic Day Parade we all witness every year on Republic Day of our country. We drew comparisons and talked about similarities & differences in class.

4. Sustainable Development and Preservation of Natural Resources – Taking inspiration from the lesson – The Crystal Cave, wherein two children show bravery to preserve the natural salt stream and crystal cave of their village, the students realized the importance of preserving the resources we are blessed with. Various measures to do the same were also discussed stressing upon the fact that it is the responsibility of every person not only in India, but whole world.



5. Deshbhakti introduced with the help of some questions like the following, the concept of Deshbhakti was introduced.

- What is a country?
- Do you love your country or respect your country?
- How will you show love / respect to your country?
- Is keeping our society clean part of Deshbhakti?



Students thought about these questions and wrote wonderful answers in their notebook like by keeping their classrooms clean, by growing trees, by not using plastic etc., they can show love to their country.

HAPPINESS CURRICULUM



In order to ensure happiness and well-being of our students, several activities pertaining to happiness and mindfulness are being organized on regular basis in MSMS. These activities cater to students' social-emotional learning, critical thinking, problem solving, and relationship building. Mindfulness, Yoga and meditation help students to bring their attention to the present moment and prepare them for a focussed learning, making their day brighter too!

Class I

Each morning, the new day begins with a "Be Well" discussion about topics such as healthy food, being active, and heaving enough sleep, breathing, yoga-based movement etc. Different poses help to improve physical fitness by improving posture, balance, coordination, and body awareness. We can witness the students being engaged in Lion pose which is a great way for the child to develop their balance skills and feel stronger.



Students were also encouraged to make Thankyou Cards for fire fighters on the occasion of International Fire Fighters' Day on 4th May.

Class: III

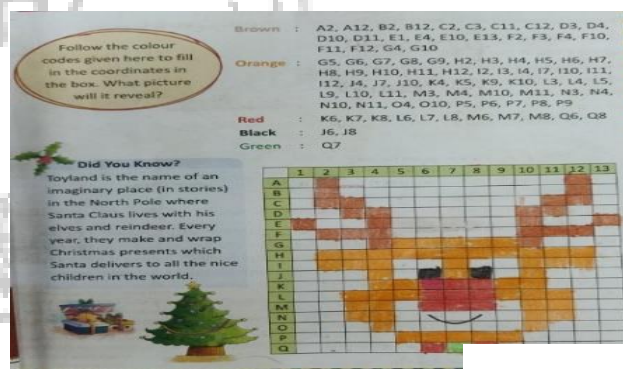
1. Family Tree: Based on the vocabulary related to relationships, a family tree was made wherein all members sat together and printed their hands/thumbs on a tree in accordance to their hierarchy in the family.



2. Colouring Fun: Colouring makes us all happy, engaged and helps us learn concepts faster and sometimes better than other methods. Some colouring tasks weaved with lessons from course book were done in classes.



Colour the objects of characters as per code provided gave students some challenge but it yielded fruitful results.



Classes V- VI

The following activities were taken up:

- Heartbeat Exercise- Jump on the spot for one minute. Stop and relax. Feel your heart beat. Deep breathe three – five times.
- Meditate- Close the eyes gently and try to free your mind of any thoughts. Focus on breath. Inhale and exhale slowly. Repeat 3 to 5 times.
- Sound Therapy – Draw complete silence and try to observe the sounds around you like the bell ringing, the birds outside sound of horns from vehicles, etc. Try to note all the sounds that you've heard.
- Focus on a spot- While breathing slowly, focus on a spot displayed in front.





- Students concentrated on their breathing, sounds in their surroundings, silence in their surroundings. Sometimes they were suggested to focus on the temperature of incoming air and outgoing air etc. while they breathe in and out.



- Story of Thomas Alva Edison, related to his schooling, was narrated in which it was emphasised that the love and trust of his mother helped him achieve the success in his life.

Students were encouraged to share their experience if someone's trust and confidence helped them to achieve their goal anytime.

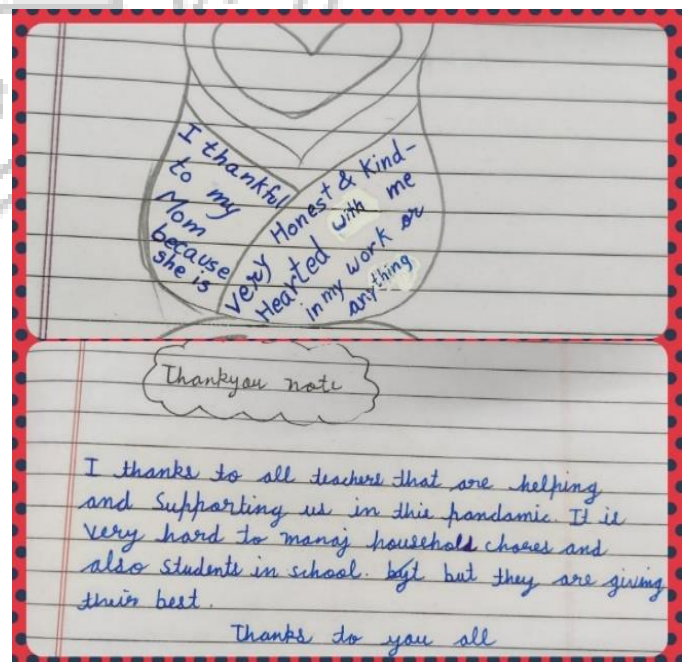


- Strengthen The Bond

SINGLE- USE PLASTIC FREE CAMPUS

“BAGGING THE PLANET EARTH IN PLASTIC IS THE SOLE REASON FOR EARTH’S POOR PROGNOSIS”.



Single Use Plastics are plastics made up from fossil fuel- based chemicals but are used only once and disposed off right after their use. These are non-biodegradable and slowly turn into micro plastics which has entered the food chain. Due to this, the Government of India has taken a bold step to set an example globally and push the Single Use Plastic (SUP) from our lives on 30th June 2022.

Under this Directive our school joined the war against pollution. Throughout the year, students of classes I to XII participated in various activities to spread awareness and curb the use of SUP.

Following activities were performed under this campaign:



- Pledge to Refuse SUP: Students of classes I to XII took pledge with their families and teachers to say no to Plastic and make our environment clean.
- Rally: Students of Class 4 organised a rally throughout the school

on 11th May 2022 they took the responsibility on their shoulders to urge the school from using SUPs. The rally went in all the classes from 1-12.

- Poster Making: Students also made colourful and creative posters to show how Earth is being affected by continuous use of plastics. The bold posters did not refrain from showing today’s reality.

- Essay Writing: Classes IX-XII decided to pen their thoughts and write insightful essays on what can be taken up as alternatives for SUP.
- Morning Assemblies: Thought provoking morning assemblies were taken up during the course of the year on topics like “Save Environment”, “Plastic Pollution”, “5 Rs” and Sustainable Developmental Goals by United Nations.
- Nukkad Natak: With catchy slogans that made people reflect on their actions, students of classes 9th presented Nukkad Natak on “Harmful Effects of Plastics”.
- Bartan Bhandar: A sustainable kitchen was set up in the school premises that only includes steel and glass containers.
- SUP Checking: Monitors are appointed to conduct surprise check-ups throughout the school and remind everyone continuously to refuse single use plastics.
- Speech: Speech on the topic “Alternatives of Single Use Plastic and our way forward” was presented by students of Class VIII.
- Banner: Our school has proudly named itself as a “Plastic- Free School”.

Eliminating Single Use Plastic from our country has proved to be a significant step in improving our planet’s health. Our school does not shy away in echoing the regulations laid down by the Government and thus, building a nation with empathetic minds.



Celebrating Scientific Aptitude of Mahavirians



Science Department of MSMS organized a display of Holidays home work done by students of Classes 5 to 9 on Parents Teacher Meeting held on July 16, 2022 in the school premises.

The aim is to provide a platform to the students to use their scientific knowledge and think critically . Our young Mahavirians showcased their scientific aptitude, creativity and talent while working on the topics like - Phasing out single used plastic, Water conservation, Health and Hygiene, Microbial world and save the planet.

- ✿ Spread the message of peace and humanity by exchanging flowers

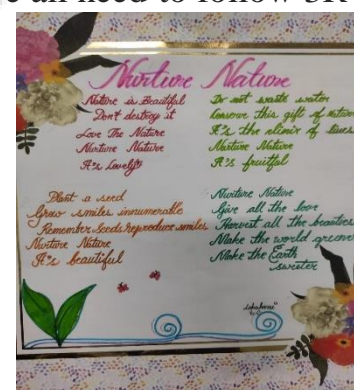
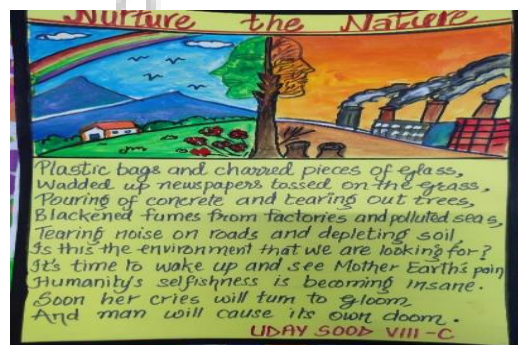


WORLD EARTH DAY-2022

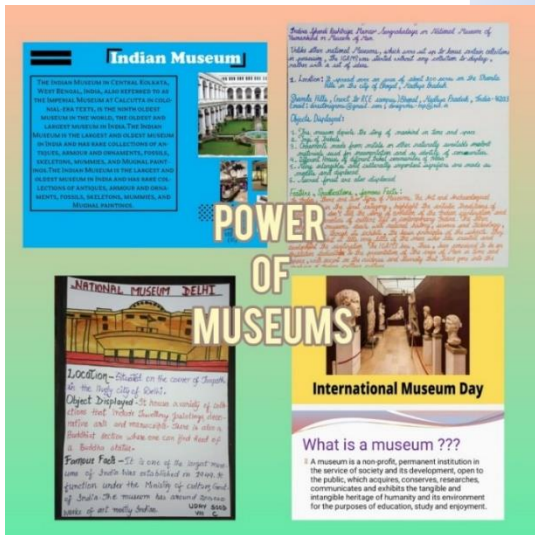

MSMS students from class I to X prepared videos disseminating the message that Health Awareness is key and it is important to raise health awareness.

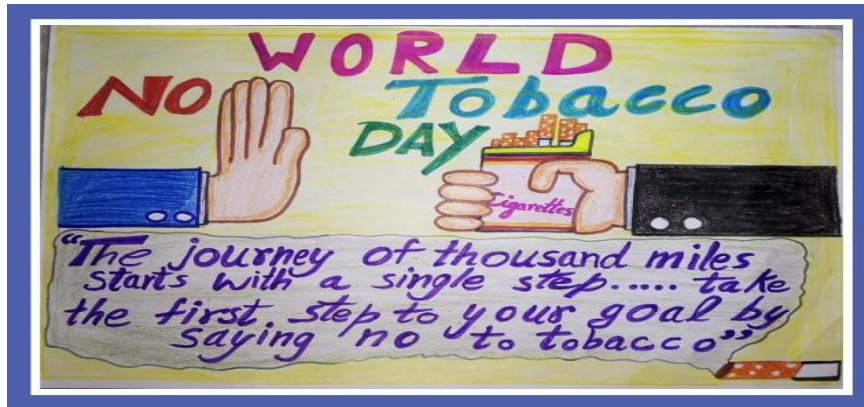

Students expressed their views on writing about why they love their school library.

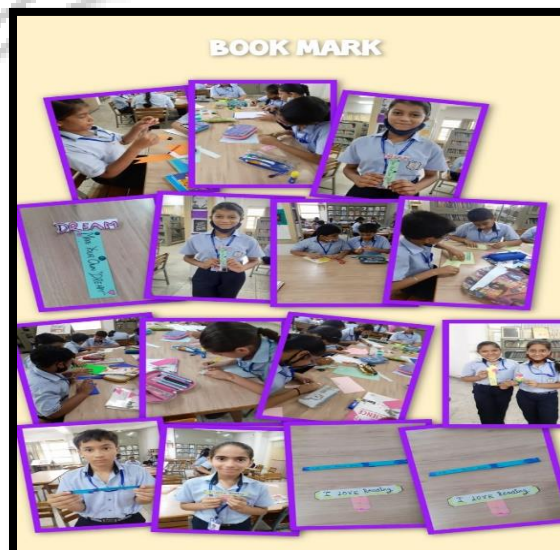
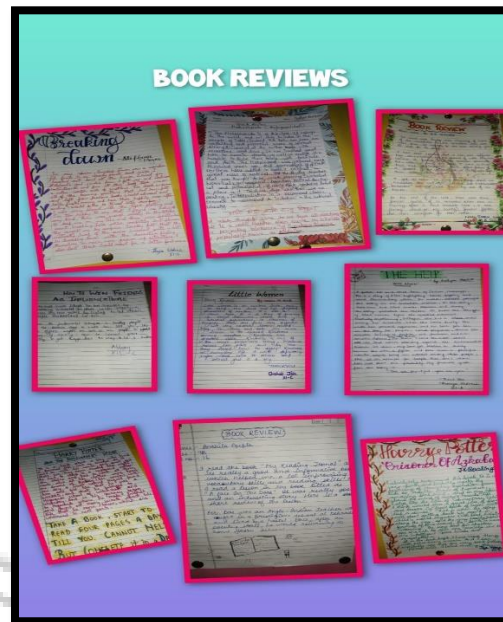

Celebration of PARYUSHAN PARV and GANESH CHATURTHI

Samvatsari is believed to be one of the holiest and most important days in the Jain calendar. This festival is celebrated on the last day of Maha Parv Paryushana and on this day, Jains beg forgiveness from all living beings for faults they have made, whether deliberately or unknowingly and they also forgive people who they have wronged by saying Michchhāmi Dukkaḍam.
