INVESTITURE CEREMONY



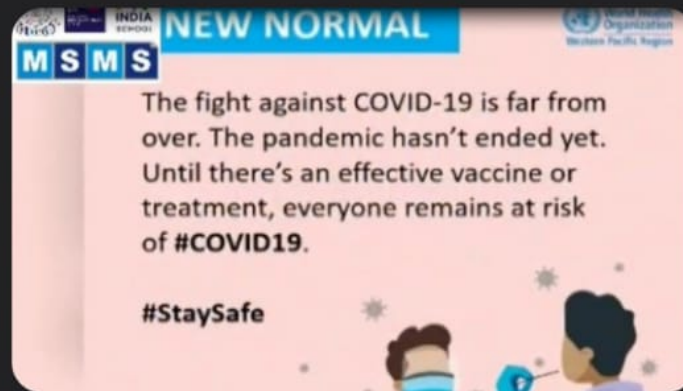

E poster was designed in order to highlight importance of vaccines and the source website to book their slots for vaccinations was mentioned.

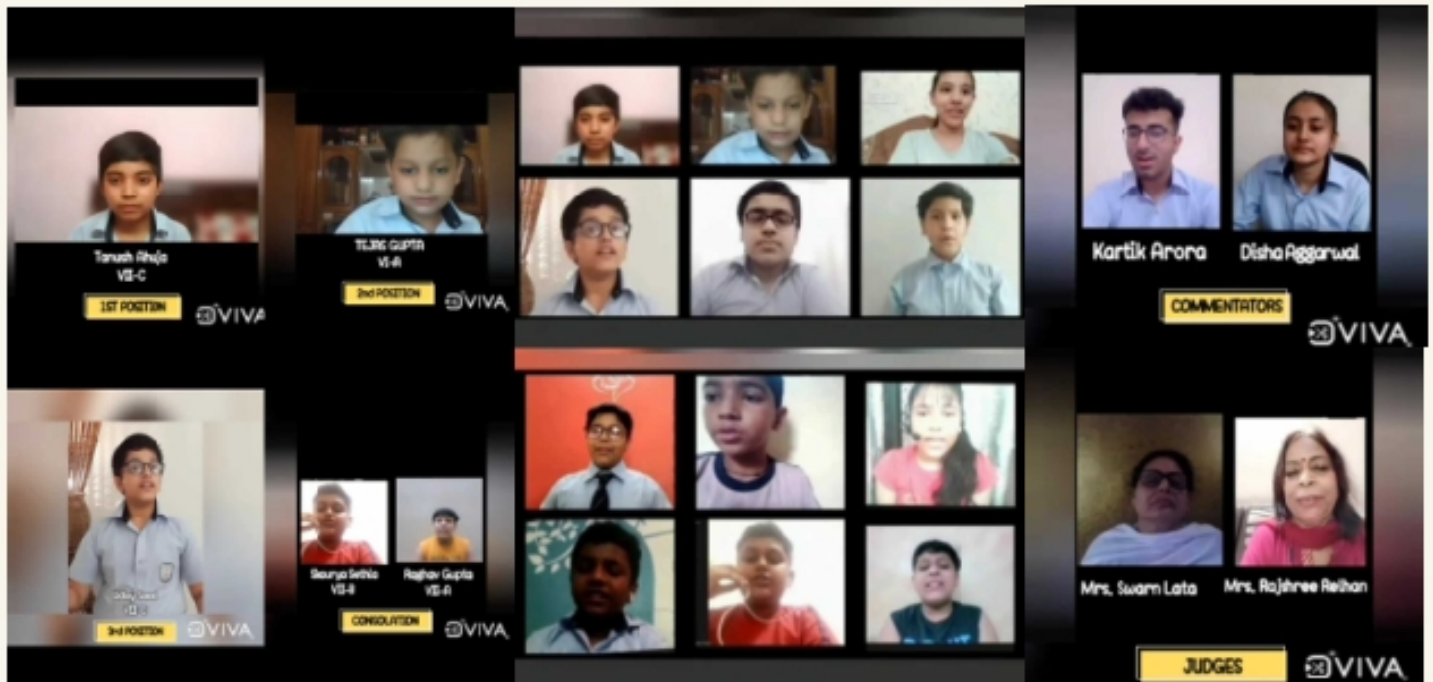
Prefectorial board also visited classes 9th -12th with the motive of spreading awareness.

Teacher's Day Celebration

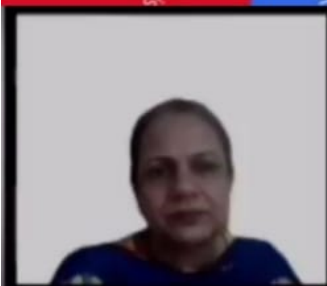
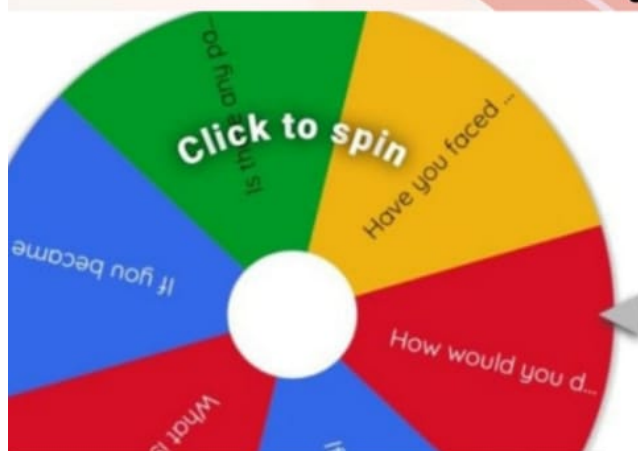
"The parents are the first teacher's and teachers are the second parents who shape the future of the students."

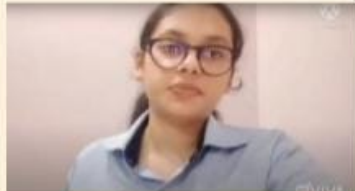
All the children participated enthusiastically & were eager to give the answers.

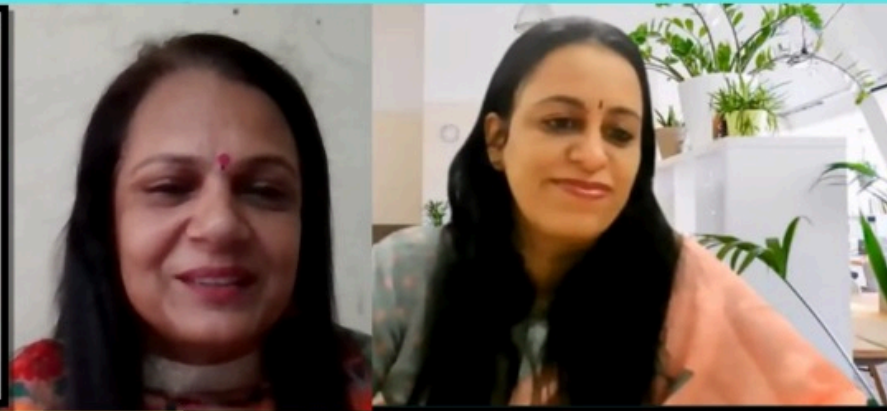

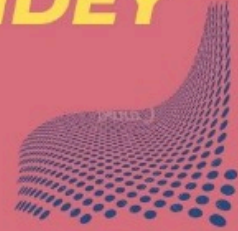
