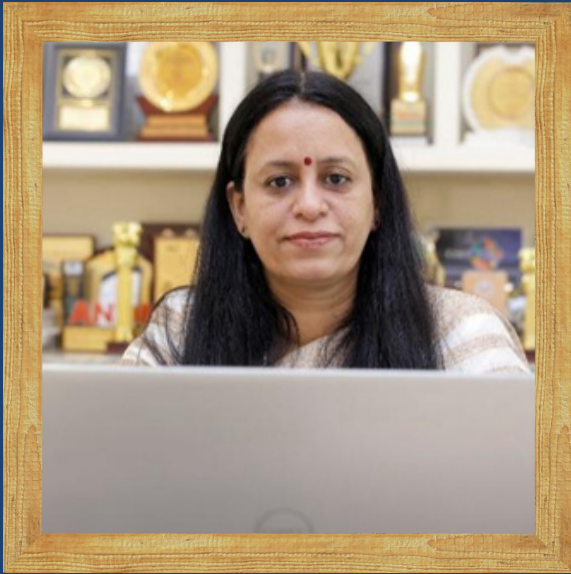

Heartiest congratulations to all students, parents, staff members, management, and stakeholders for their collective dedication towards building a greener and smarter future for our school.

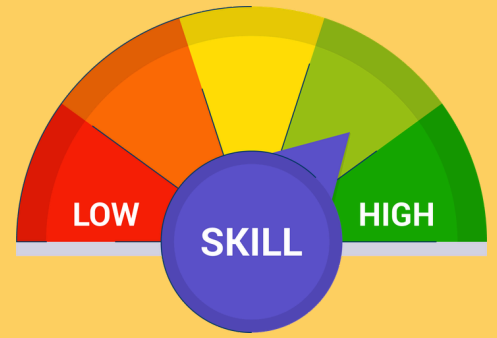

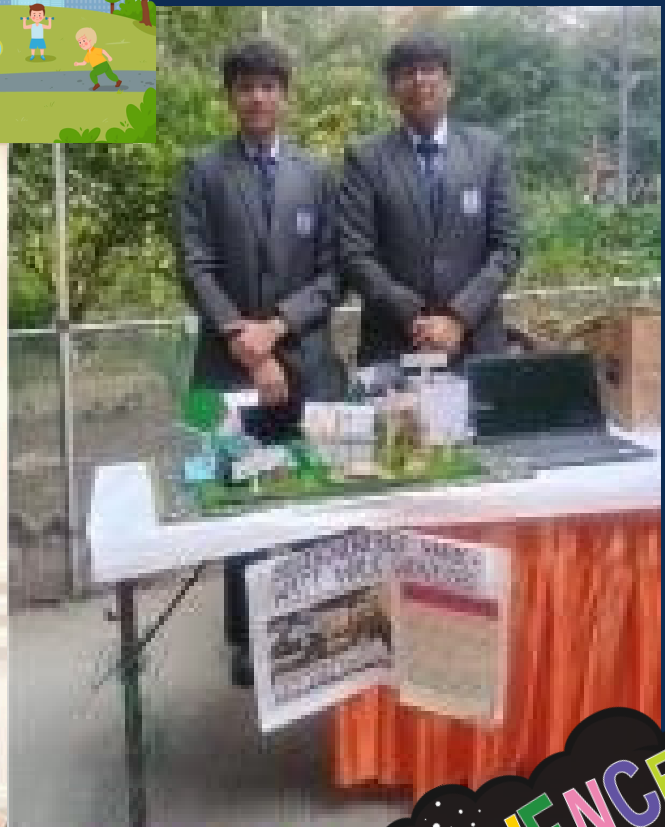
Accolade in Science Exhibition

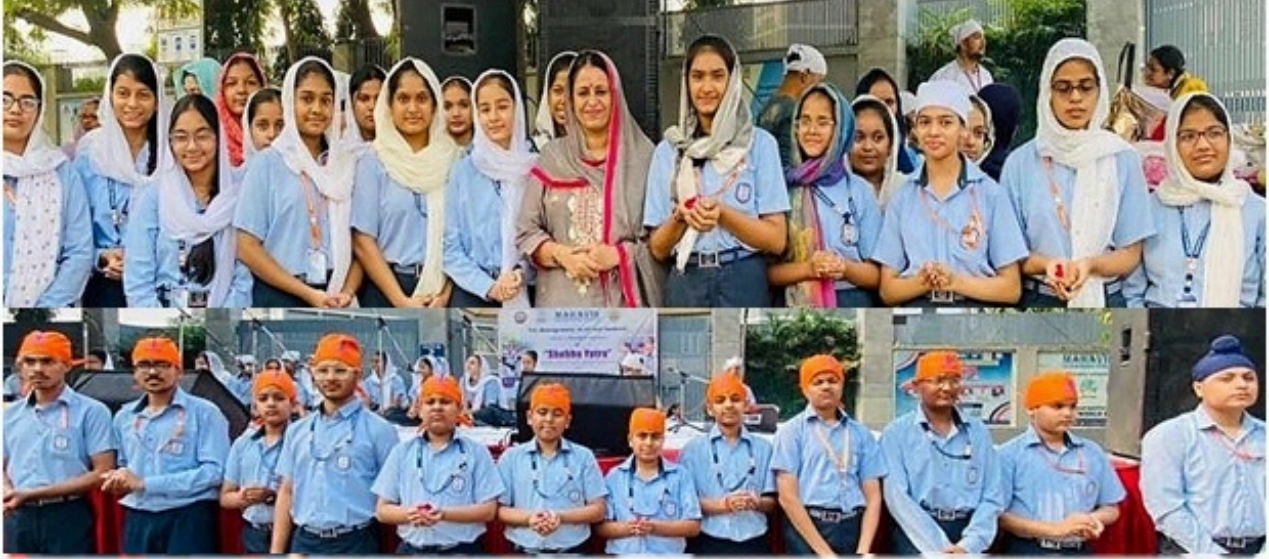

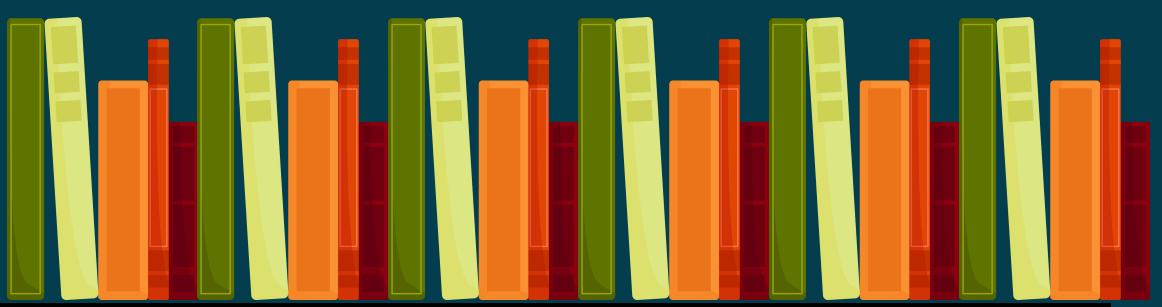
महावीर सी. माँ. स्कूल ने श्रद्धा-सम्मान से किया 350वीं शोभा यात्रा का स्वागत

MSMS principal Ruchika Sukhija shared her belief that the greatest gift a school can give is not merely knowledge, but the courage to dream and the language to express it.

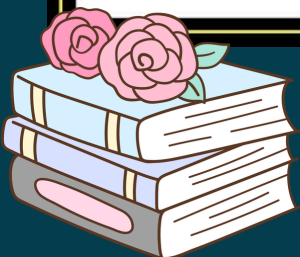

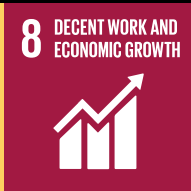
The award reflects not just academic excellence but also the school's commitment to shaping responsible and compassionate citizens of tomorrow.

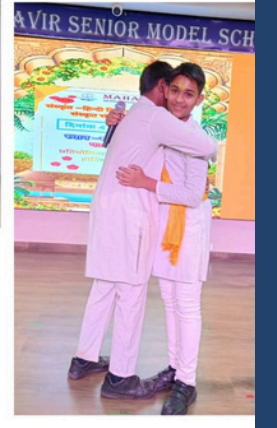
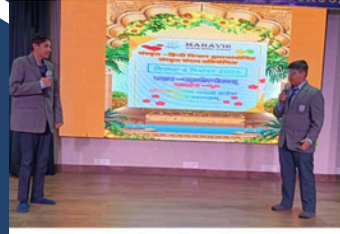
Faces of Discovery- Role-Play Competition

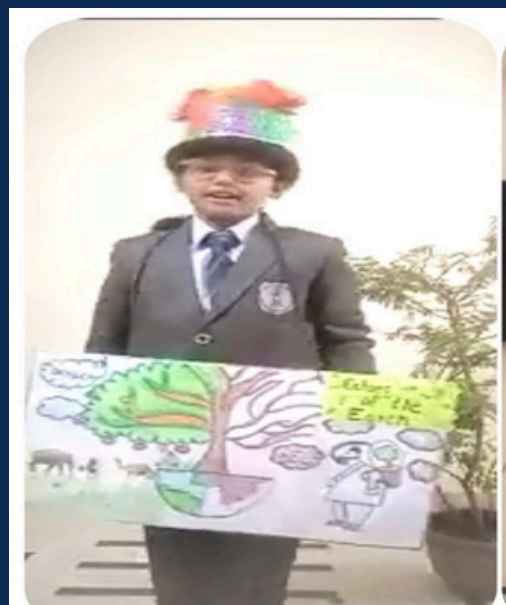
Green Gaze Nutri fest Green Power Bowl

The initiative helped students understand the values of empathy, respect, and social responsibility, highlighting that true celebration lies in sharing happiness.



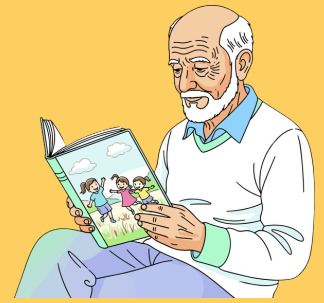
Winter Clothes Donation Drive

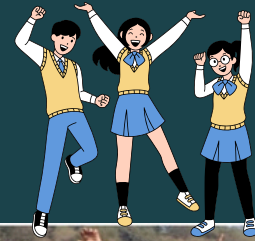
EXCURSION TO LOHAGARH

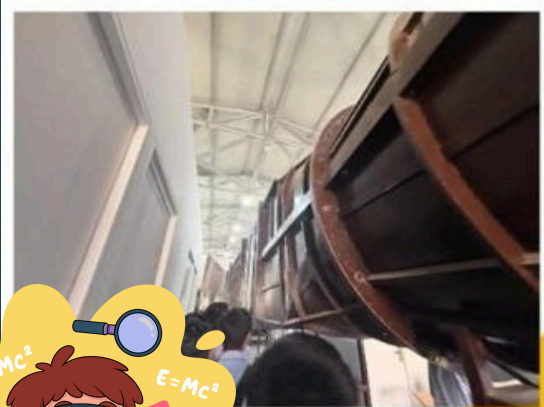

Annual Tiger Fest



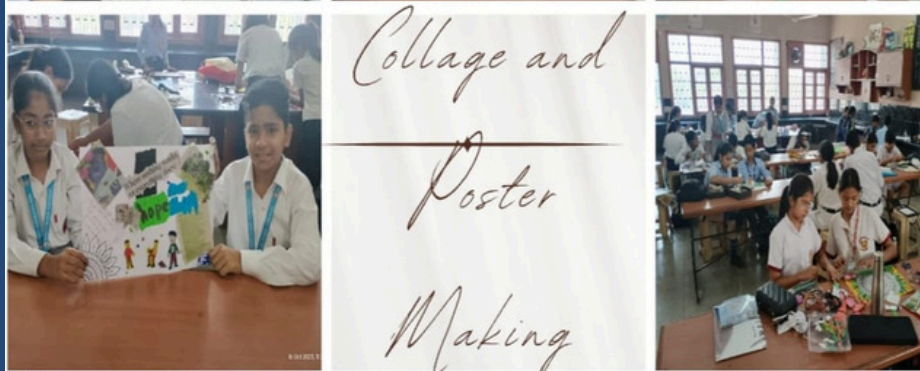

Capacity Building Program for Accountancy Educators

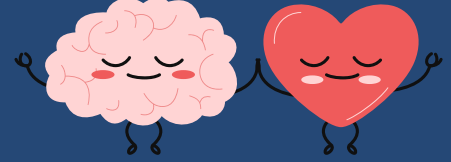
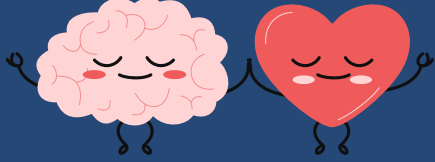

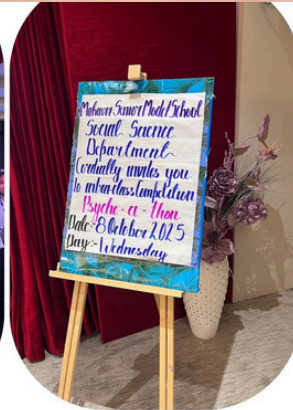

Mental Health Awareness Drive

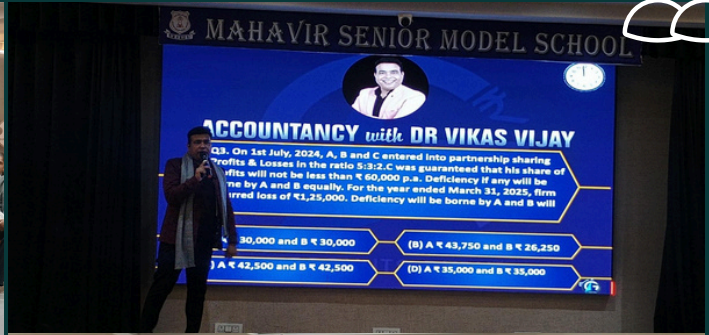

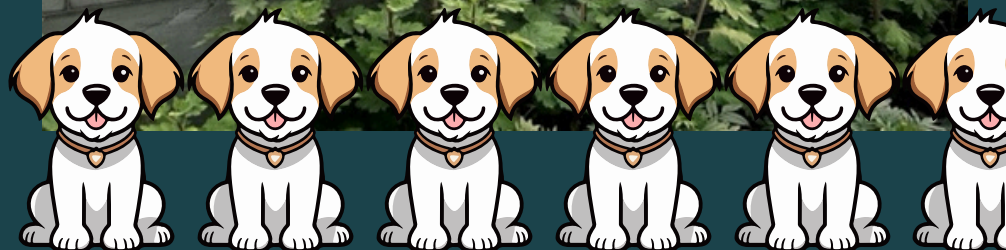
Session On Understanding Dogs

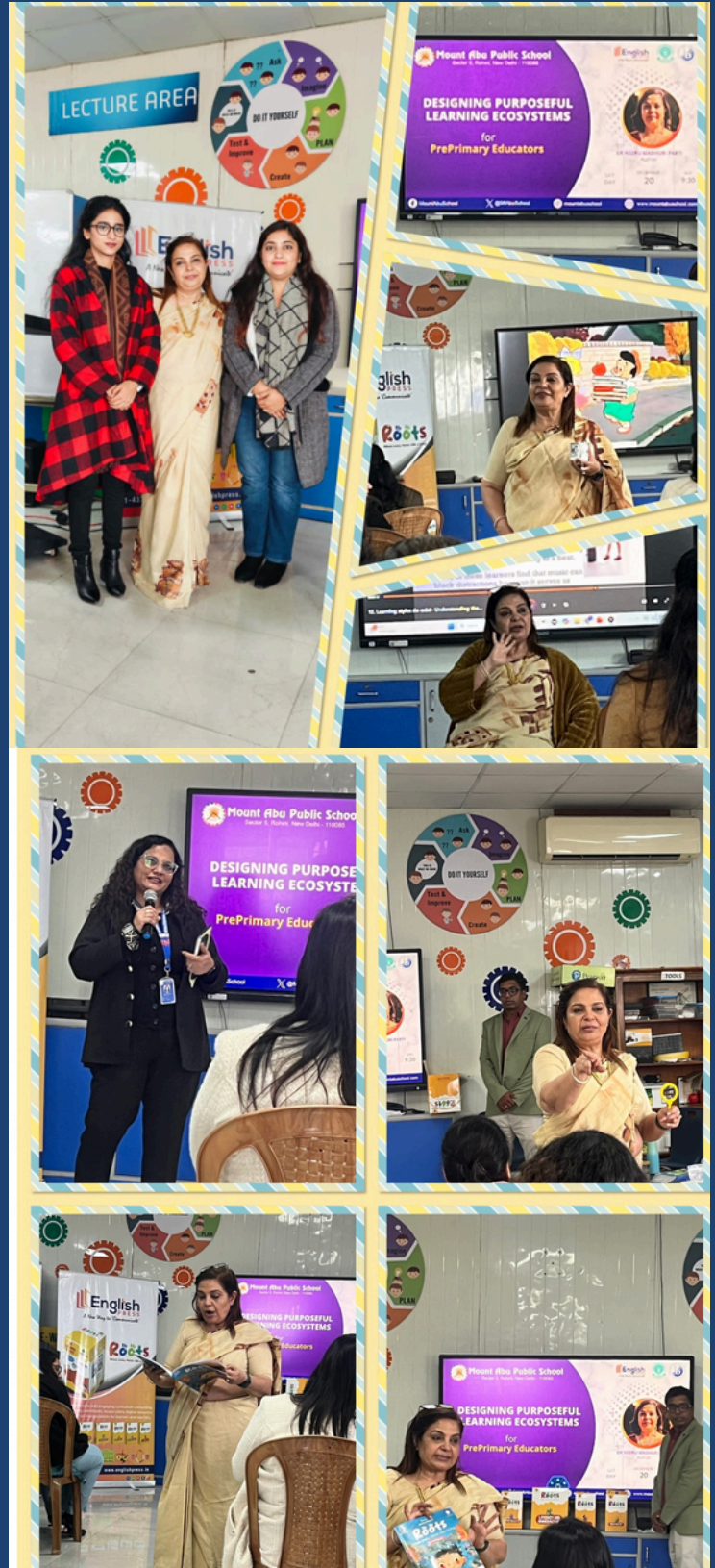
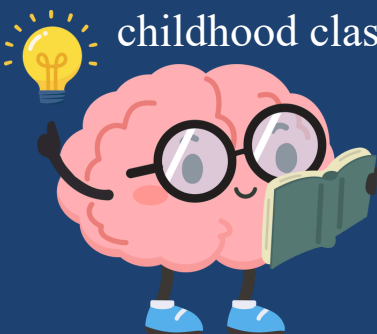

He actively participated in the Non-Cooperation Movement and later played a vital role in the Indian National Congress, becoming one of the key leaders in India's fight for independence after independence,

Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru became the first Prime Minister of India. He worked tirelessly for the progress and modernization of the nation. Nehru loved children dearly, and the children affectionately called him 'Chacha Nehru'. His birthday, 14th November, is celebrated every year as Children's Day across the country. 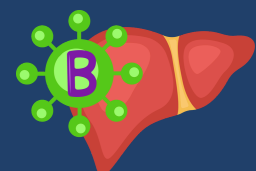

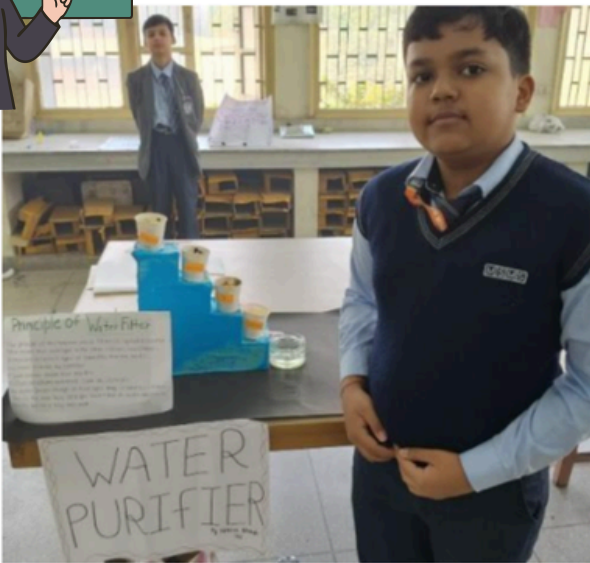


Science Wizards -

Children's Day Activity – “Petals of Positivity”



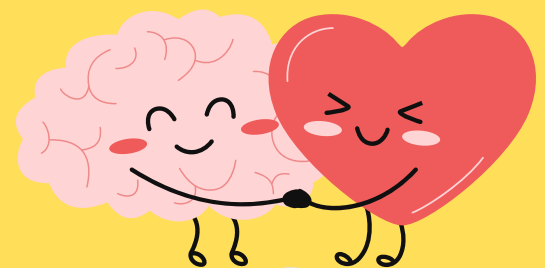

Rangoli Decoration Activity – Diwali Celebration



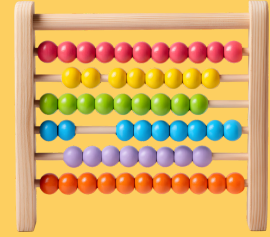

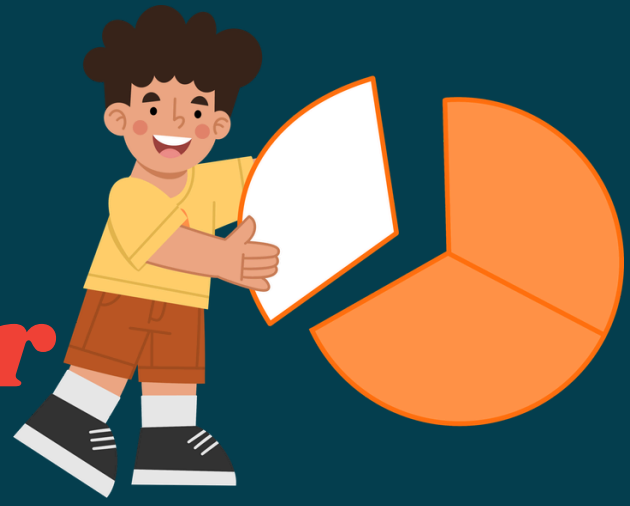
Trash to Treasure Activity



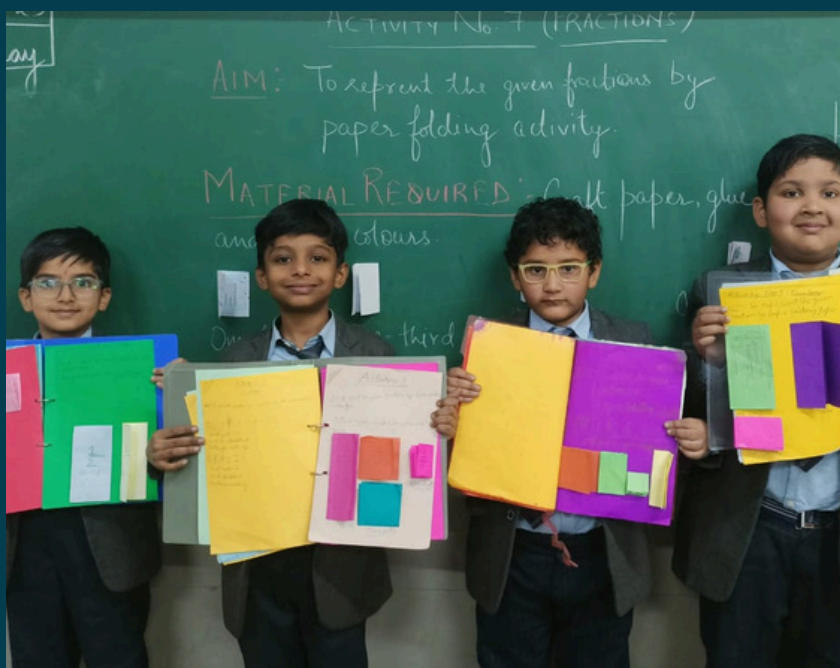
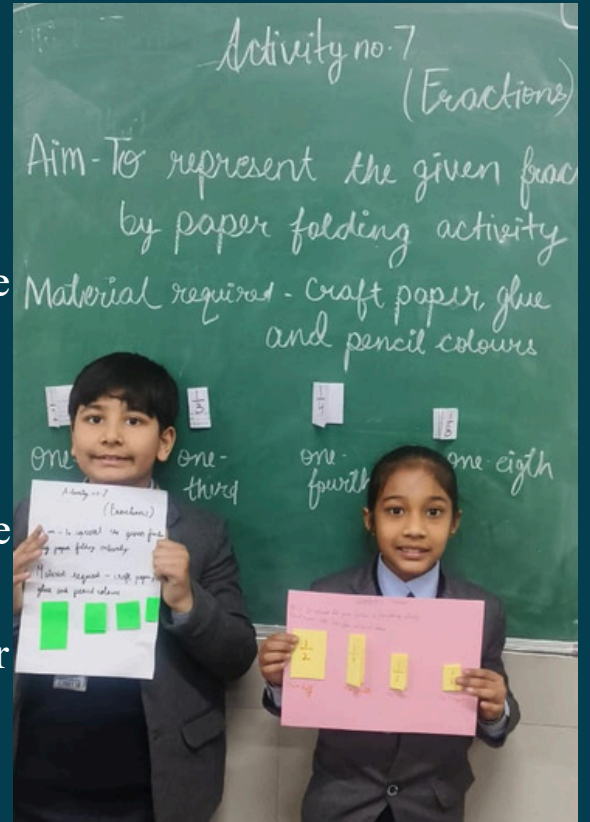

On 31 December, a hands-on activity on fractions was conducted in Grade III to help students understand the concept of equal parts of a whole through paper folding. Students used paper sheets to create fractions such as one half, one third, one fourth and one eighth by folding the paper into equal sections. This activity helped learners visually identify fractions and understand their relationships. The interactive session enhanced conceptual clarity, mathematical vocabulary and fine motor skills, making learning meaningful and enjoyable.





Health and Nutrition Activity



The Science Department organized the “Health and Nutrition” activity for students of Grade 4 and 5 on 27th October, 2025 to bring awareness about the importance of nutritious meals through hands on activity. Students brought sprouts, boiled chickpeas, chopped onions, tomatoes and coriander and enthusiastically prepared their nutritious meals and shared with their partners. This activity ingrained collaboration, interactive participation, teamwork and sense of belongingness among students.

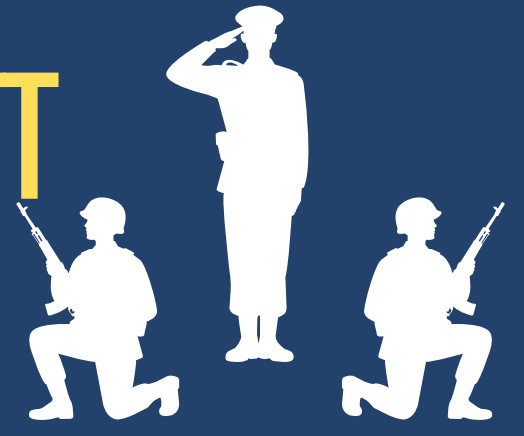

A debate activity was conducted for the students of Class VII on the topic “Offline Markets vs Online Markets on 24.12.2025

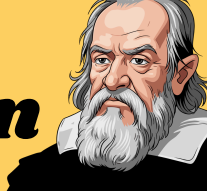
The activity was organized with the objective of encouraging critical thinking, enhancing communication skills, and helping students understand the differences between offline and online markets.

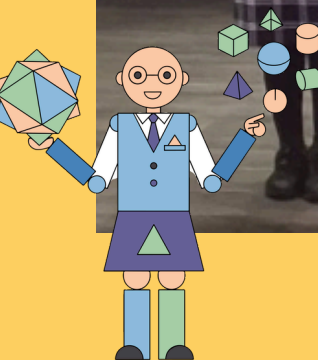
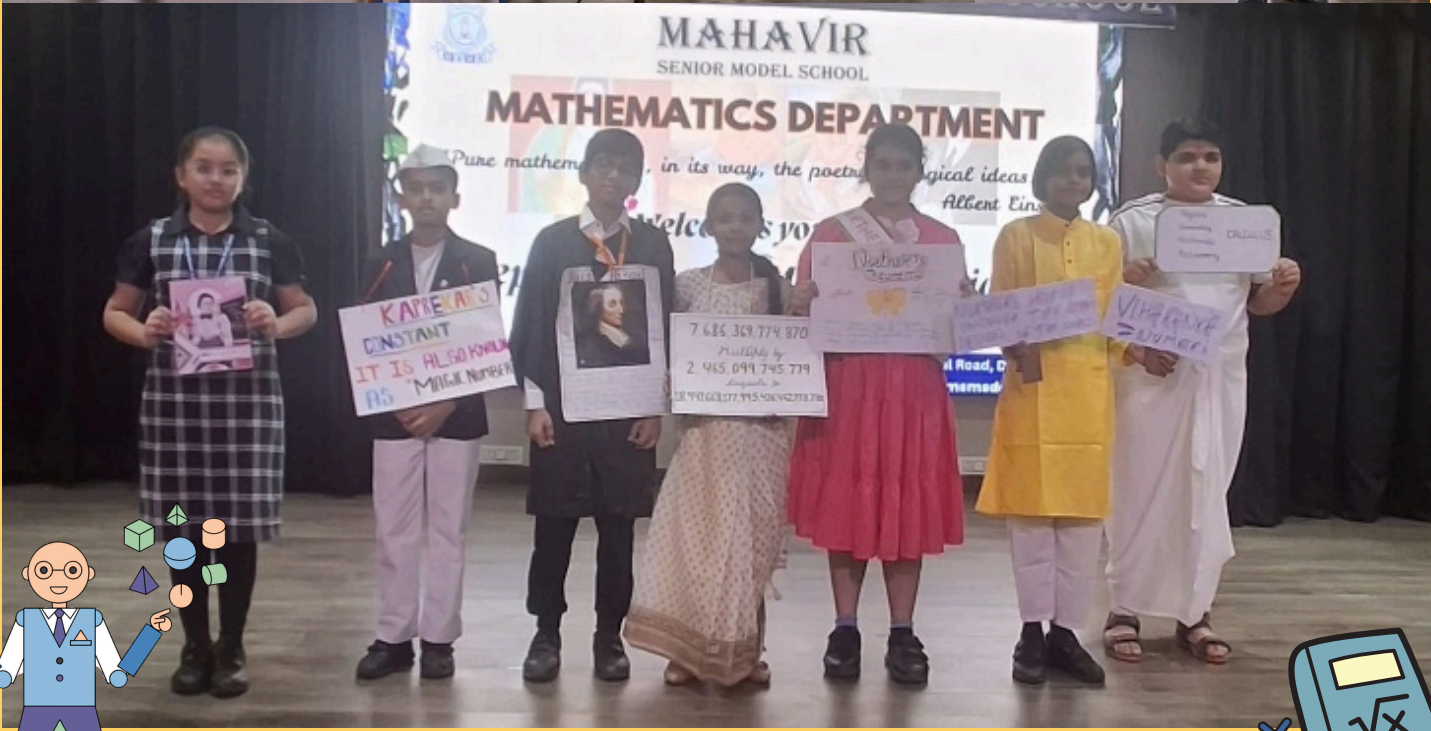




Representing a Mathematician

- It emphasized the importance of gaining knowledge about the Constitution and promoting responsible citizenship.

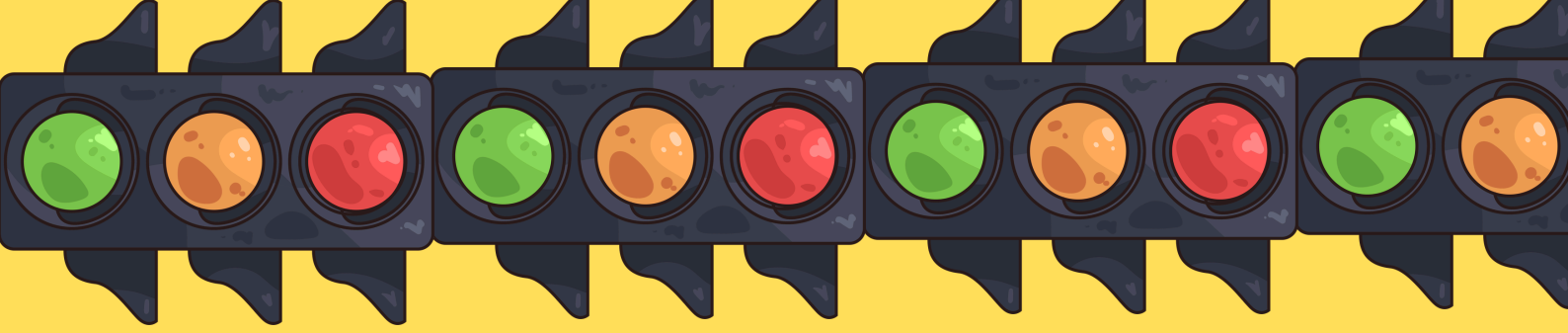

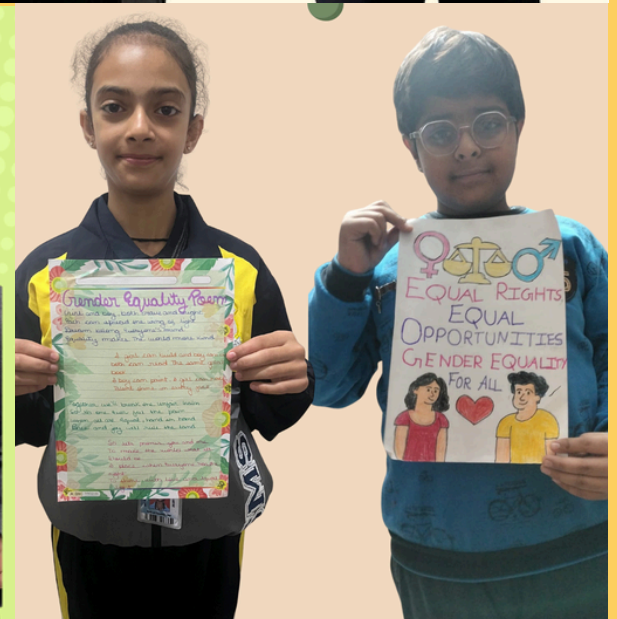
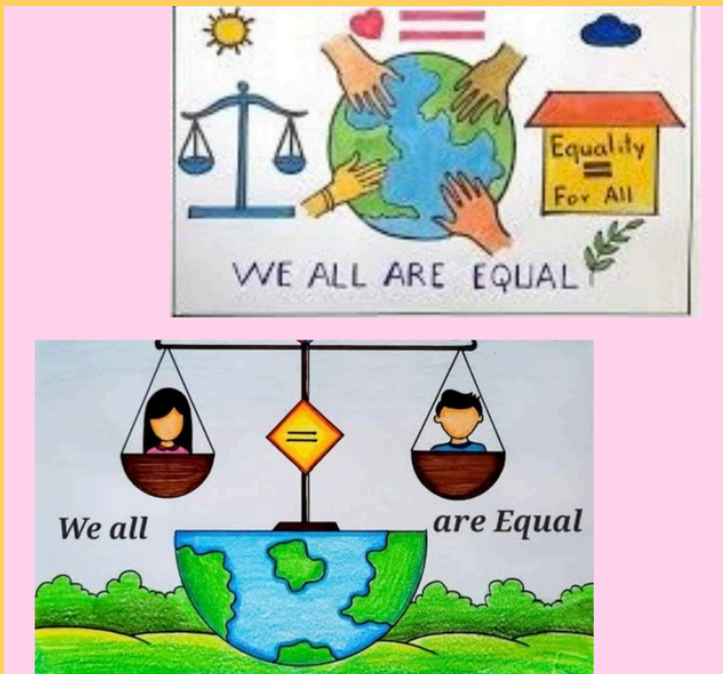


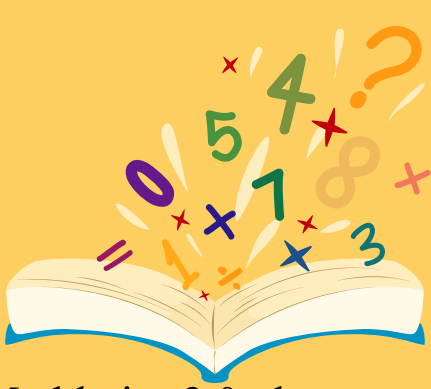


Gender Equality Awareness Activities

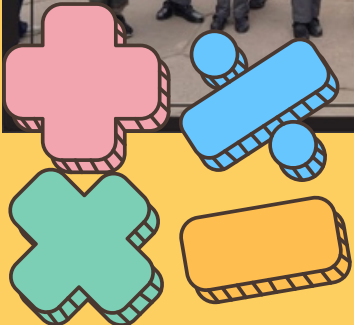




MATHLETICS 2.0: A Celebration of Mathematics

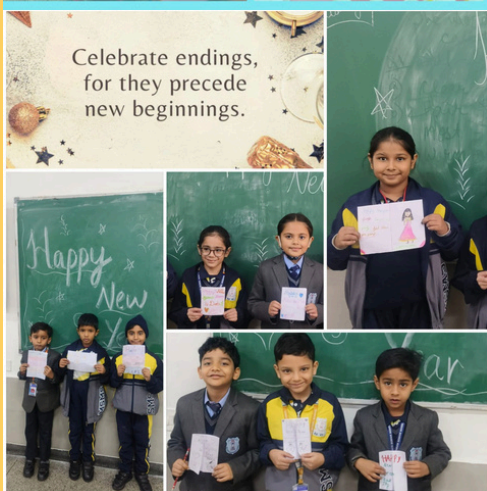

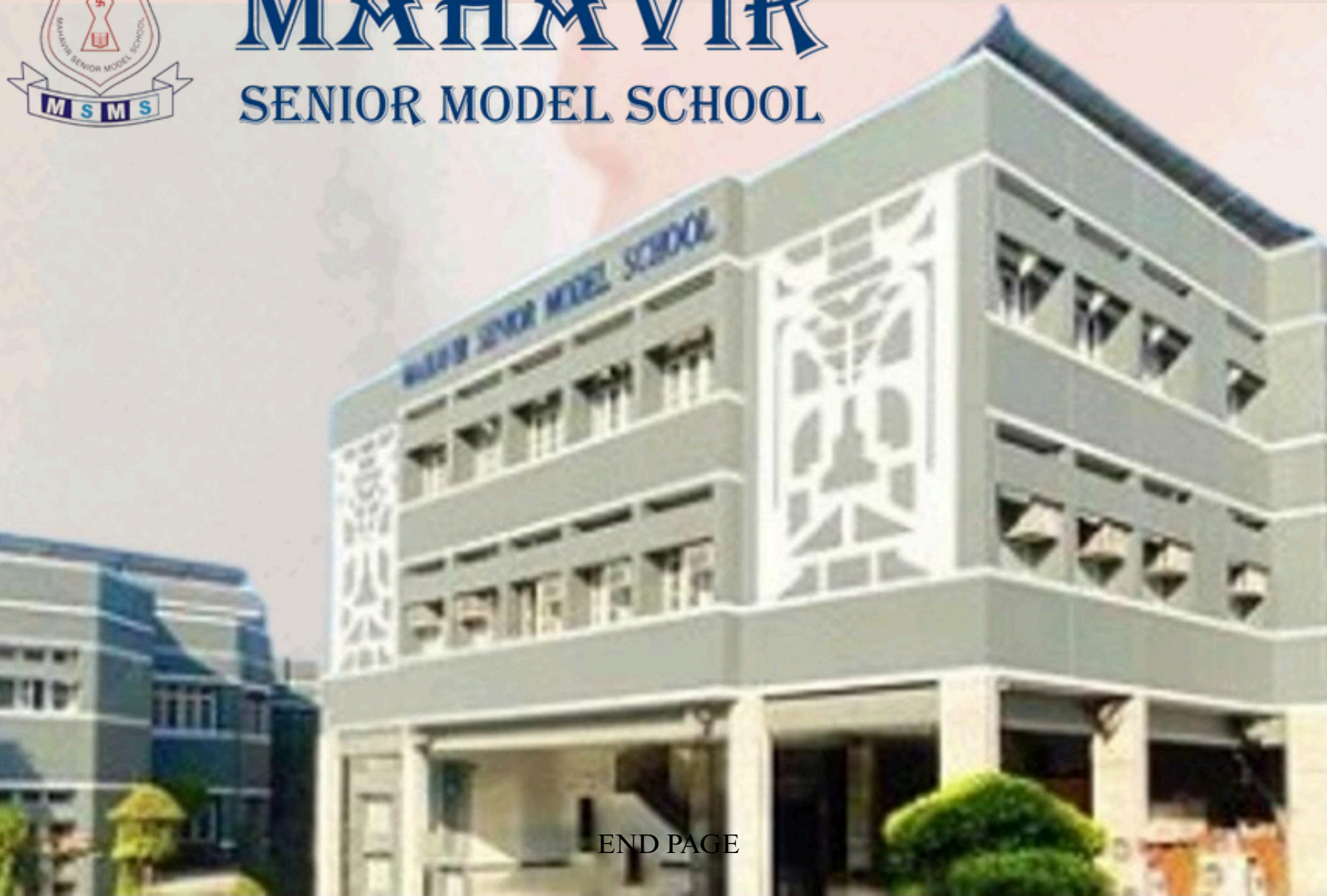
