Education is a shared responsibility between school and home and during these crucial pandemic times, both these units have worked in exemplary unison and have provided the best to the children.







Keeping this in mind YWCA of India and Anon Global Foundation in collaboration with Mahavir Senior Model School presented an online session on Anti Bullying for students of class VI to VIII on Tuesday, 12th January 2021.



The online session commenced with a warm welcome of resource persons Ms. Arti Girdhar, Philanthropist and Educationist, Ms. Deepa Choudhary, Motivational speaker of Anon Global Foundation and Ms. Mansi Prabhakaran, Youth Connect. by Principal, Mrs. Ruchika Sukhija.



To create an amiable environment and positive School climate, students were explained about bullying and cyber bullying. Children were also told about the difference between teasing and bullying, the bullying circle and antibullying laws in school. They discussed severe detrimental effects of those who are bullied and that these effects could be immediate or cause lifelong damage.

Various ways to tackle bullying and cyber bullying were shared. Sensitization and prevention of bullying in schools, the methods of intervention and prevention were discussed.

ONLINE SESSION ON ONLINE GAMING ADDICTION FOR CLASSES IX AND X

"We need to control our mind rather than to control the technology."

YWCA of India and Anon Global Foundation in collaboration with Mahavir Senior Model School conducted a Webinar on a prominent issue of concern, Online Gaming Addiction on 15th January 2021. The resource persons were Ms. Arti Girdhar, Philanthropist and Educationist and Ms. Prachi Biswas Head, Communications and Community Outreach.



The day commenced on a pious note by seeking blessings of Lord Mahavira through the rendition of Navkar Mantra. The session was initiated with a warm welcome of resource persons by Principal, Mrs. Ruchika Sukhija.

The resource persons initiated the session by telling the students how online gaming turns into addiction.

They were guided as to how to find out whether the addiction had set in, by looking for the symptoms:


- 1. Craving: continuous desire to indulge in gaming
- 2. Control: no control finding it difficult to stop
- 3. Coping: using gaming as a way to cope up with personal or social issues
- 4. Compulsion: unable to take interest in any other activity
- 5. Consequences: Poor performance in academics, social issues, physical problems, and psychological issues.

The students were encouraged to realize that they need to achieve the long-term happiness, in the real life and to make changes in their lifestyle by controlling their thoughts through mindfulness.

Further, the following pertinent points were shared, as the solutions to the online gaming addiction:

Accept responsibility, Identify the impact, don't blame others for your mistakes, stay positive, set limits, develop a personal priority list, if no self-control - take help from the parents, develop skills like -reading, writing, gardening, playing instruments, singing, drawing, solve puzzles that could boost the mind.

It was an interactive session wherein the resource persons addressed the students' queries, encouraging them to be one's best friend and to utilize their time with indulgence in focused activities



WEBINAR ON STREAM SELECTION BY CAREER LAUNCHER

"When everything seems dark around you, look carefully you may be the light".



MSMS in collaboration with Career Launcher presented an online workshop on the topic stream selection on 30th January 2021 for classes IX and X. The session was attended by 125 participants.

The keynote speaker, Ms. Neha Wahi, Associate Vice President, Career Launcher initiated the webinar by discussing the right and wrong ways of selecting

streams and informed students about importance of class X scores in the future life of a person. She told students not to select subjects because of Parents influence, Siblings Influence, Herd mentality: Don't choose a subject because many others are choosing it.

She further shared rules to select a subject-

1. **Rule of Selection**: Select subject with which student can fall in love, can spend time.

2. **Rule of Elimination**: Eliminate subjects which can

spoil the result, can't be done, prone to make silly mistakes.

- 3. Observe **personality trait** while choosing a subject.
- 4. Check **Aptitude** for a particular subject.


She also discussed about:

- ■□ Various career options beside well known path of Engineering, Medical and CA.
- ■☐ How important it is for students of science streams to have a backup plan along with aiming for an admission in IIT's and Medical.
- ■□ Variety of options available other than engineering and medicine which are open for all the students, such as law, National Defence Services.

- Alternate courses in medical sciences like paramedics and alternative therapeutic approaches such as Ayurveda, Naturopathy etc.
- ■□ Stream neutral courses which the student of any stream can opt.
- ■□ Future perspective of CS, Actuary and Chartered Financial Analyst.

Students gained valuable information regarding stream selection and various career option available in the chosen stream.



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VIRTUAL PTM

CONDUCTED FOR CLASSES I to XII SESSION: 2020-2021

Individually, We are one drop. Together, we are an Ocean.

On 7th November 2020, Parent Teacher Meeting was organised for all sections of Classes I to XII on the virtual platform. The class teachers conducted the PTM for parents of students of their sections in four slots, starting from 8:30 a.m to 12.10 p.m.

Main points of discussion were:

1. Parents were assured that there are sincere efforts taken by the school and the teachers in providing Quality education to the children, thereby looking

forward to the betterment of the child.

2. Many queries of the parents regarding the Payment of fees were duly answered. They were sincerely informed about the online fee payment avenues (Entab Software) that the school has provided considering the ongoing situation. They were also informed about the option of

dropping the cheque at the school gate.

3. Parents were requested to ensure that their ward keeps up with and regularly attends the online classes and must write an email at school ID in case if the child takes a leave and also practices the study material that is sent on a regular basis. Many points related to how the student can manage

his/her time effectively and can ensure steady learning in the given situation at home,

were also discussed.

4. Parents were advised to motivate the child to practice continuous writing as

well, to make sure that the student does not lose touch of writing, since most of the learning is being done using online tools.

5. They were also informed about the upcoming Unit test III to be conducted Online next month. They had many queries related to the preparation for Final Exams in senior classes and how the child will take the Exam, which were resolved by the Class teachers.

Parents were specifically mentioning about the mock

test arranged for each class, with which the child would get acquainted with the process of giving the Halfyearly exams online,

and is well prepared on the day of the Exam.

6. Many parents raised issues of network and problems of connectivity during

classes due to which the child sometimes misses out on the topic being done.

They were assured that the child can contact the concerned teacher for

clearing his/her doubts, and can also refer to the study material that is sent to support the topic covered in

Online Classes and must attend Enrichment classes designed for the same.

Overall, parents were very encouraging and supportive,

and were extremely appreciative of the efforts taken by the Management, Director Sir, PrincipalMrs Ruchika Sukhija and the teachers. They acknowledged that teachers have put in their sincere best efforts in providing continuous guidance for their children.

Parents also praised the principal and the school for this quick, smart, technological implementation through Virtual Classroom, Online Assessments and virtual PTM to extend the immediate solution to teaching and learning, during the pandemic .

NATIONAL EPILEPSY DAY







In the exhibit hall, each innovation was explained by a complete experiment in pdf format along with a project video for demonstration which provide a clear picture of each experiment.








WORLD AIDS DAY

Class 10 students made posters about how to follow a healthy way of life by preventing themselves from






such dreadful disease. Students were told to shed inhibition and come forward to spread the message in their surroundings.

To sensitize the students about this serious issue, teachers discussed about corruption and its ill effects with them. They were given Poster making and Slogan writing activities also. Our young learners have also














CLASS 3: RANGOMETRY


CLASS 7 and 8: REPRESENTING A MATHEMATICIAN

PARVASI BHARTIYA DIVAS (NRI DAY) :-9/01/2021






VISIONAIR 2020: TIME TRAVEL (RIDING INTO THE FUTURE)
